Leaven (Leviticus 2:11)

"No grain offering that you bring to the LORD shall be made with leaven, for you shall burn no leaven nor any honey as a food offering to the LORD.

Leaven (Genesis 19:3b)

And he made them a feast and baked unleavened bread, and they ate.

Leaven (Genesis 18:6)

And Abraham went quickly into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quick! Three seahs of fine flour! Knead it, and make cakes."

Leaven (Exodus 12:8)

They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it.

Leaven (Matthew 13:33)

He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened."

Leaven (Matthew 16:6)

Jesus said to them, "Watch and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees."

Leaven (Matthew 16:12)

Then they understood that he did not tell them to beware of the leaven of bread, but of the teaching of the Pharisees and Sadducees.

Leaven (1 Cor. 5:7)

Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.

Leaven (Conclusions)

- 1. Leaven is not bad
- 2. It is a powerful metaphor for things both good and bad
- 3. God's command in Leviticus 2 is a literal requirement.

4. Use of unleavened bread for burnt offerings is evocative: a. Passover b. Communion with heaven c. Spontaneity / Freshness


