# Luke 2:17

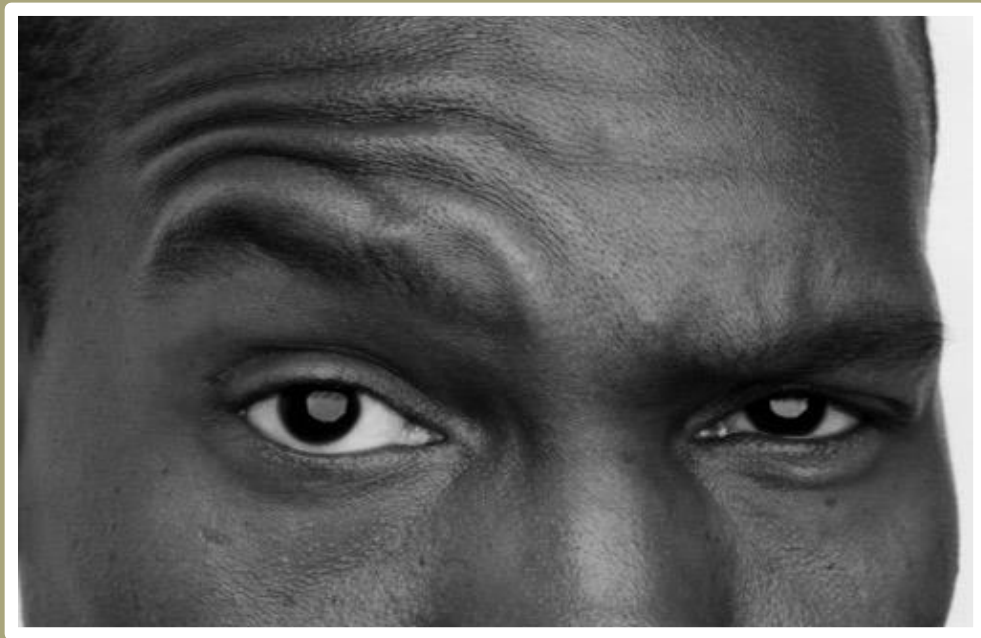
And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been
