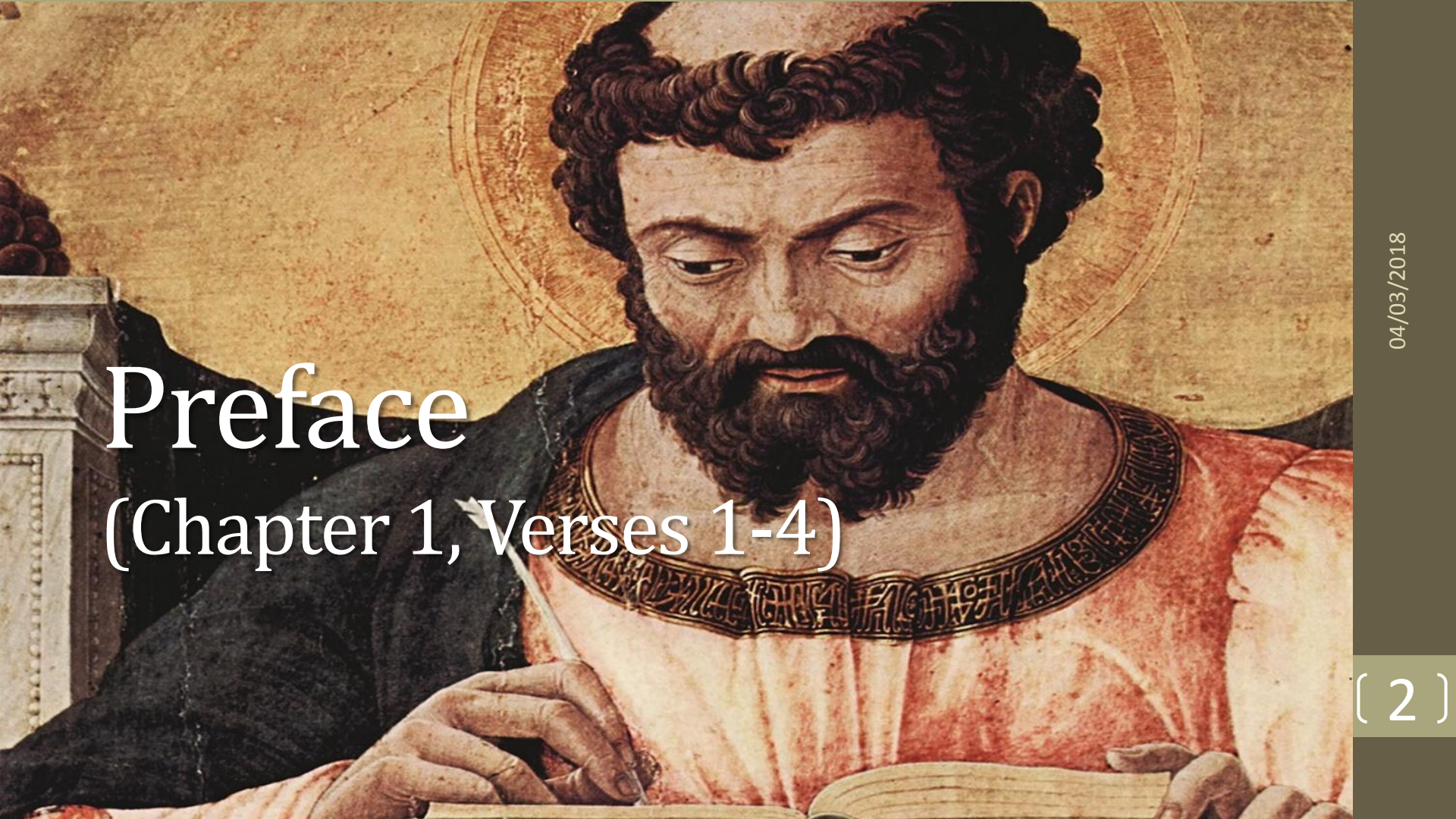

Luke 3:1-3 (Review)

- Historical context (vv. 1-2a)
- “word of God came to John, in the wilderness of Abilene” (v. 2b)
- by the Jordan he was, “proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sin.” (v. 3)

Luke 3:4-6 (Review)

- Luke compares this to voice of one crying in the wilderness from Isaiah 40:3-5: **“Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight...and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.” (vv. 4-6)**

Luke 3:7-9

(Review)

- To the people who came out to be baptized by him, he said **“bear fruits in keeping with repentance”** because merely being children of Abraham would not save them from the wrath to come.

Luke 3:10-14 (Review)

- The crowds asked him “**what then shall we do.**”
- John answered them (in effect) be charitable, just, gentle,

Luke 3:15

As the people were in expectation,
and all were questioning in their
hearts concerning John, whether
he might be the Christ,

Luke 3:16

John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

Luke 3:17

His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Luke 3:18

So with many other exhortations
he preached good news to the
people.

Luke 3:19-20

But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison.

Luke 3:21

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened,

Luke 3:22

and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Luke 3:23

Jesus, when he began his ministry,
was about thirty years of age,
being the son (as was supposed)
of Joseph, the son of Heli,
