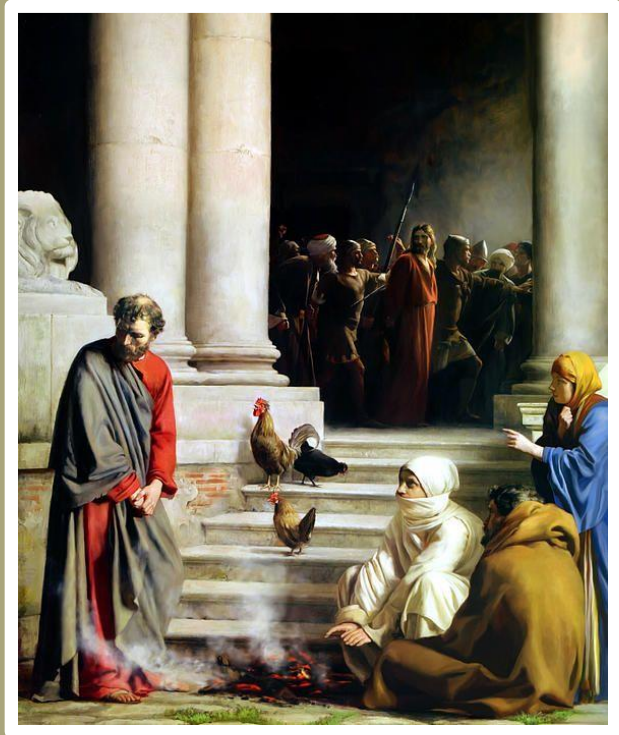
“And I tell you, everyone who acknowledges me before men, the Son of Man also will acknowledge before the angels of God,
