Luke 20:27

There came to him some
Sadducees, those who deny that
there is a resurrection,

Luke 20:28

and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother.

Luke 20:29

Now there were seven brothers.
The first took a wife, and died
without children.

Luke 20:30

And the second

and the third took her, and likewise
all seven left no children and died.

Luke 20:32

Afterward the woman also died.

Luke 20:33

In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had her as wife."

Luke 20:34

And Jesus said to them, "The sons of this age marry and are given in marriage,

Luke 20:35

but those who are considered
worthy to attain to that age and to
the resurrection from the dead
neither marry nor are given in
marriage,

Luke 20:36

for they cannot die anymore,
because they are equal to angels
and are sons of God, being sons of
the resurrection.

Luke 20:37

But that the dead are raised, even Moses showed, in the passage about the bush, where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham and the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.

Luke 20:38

Now he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for all live to him."

Luke 20:39

Then some of the scribes answered, "Teacher, you have spoken well."

Luke 20:40

For they no longer dared to ask him any question.
